#### Kids Hope - changing lives ONE child, ONE hour, ONE school year at a time!

Crossroads is an affiliate of Kids Hope USA, a national mentoring organization, pairing local churches with a local school, impacting the lives of at-risk elementary students. We partner with Jefferson Elementary school here in Plymouth by providing trained adult mentors who spend quality time, one hour a week, in a one-on-one relationship with a child in need of a loving, caring adult in their life. Mentors meet during the student's lunch and recess, enjoy conversation, play games, read books, and work on academics, all the while forming a relationship built upon love, acceptance, trust, and care.
